Use these leaves to make a picture or collage.</p> 	<p><b>Create:</b> Help a grown up bake something for the family. Draw a picture or photo of what you baked</p> 	<p><b>Create</b> your own home learning task.</p> 
<p><b>Writing challenge</b></p> <p>Practise writing, tracing or copying letters using 'and' to start each letter. Say the phrase and look at our letter formation sheet to help you learn them.</p>	<p><b>Write:</b> Practise writing your name. Remember to start each letter using 'and'.</p>	<p><b>Order:</b> Use some paint or draw around everyone's hand prints in your family and then cut them out.
