What to do

IMPORTANT Parent or Carer –
Please check that you are happy with any weblinks or use of the internet.

1. Counting practice

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Lay cards with numbers on in a line 1 to 20.

- Ask your child to turn around or else blindfold them!
- o Remove one number but rearrange the rest so no gap is to be seen.
- Ask the child to count along the line and to tell you when they think a number is missing. Can they identify the place it should go?
- Ask them to place a finger between the two numbers where they think the missing number belongs.
- Show the number you stole! Are they correct?
- o Repeat, taking a different number.

Extension

 Lay the cards so the line counts backwards from 20 to 1. This makes it harder!

2. Working together

- o Play Higher / Lower
 - You need number cards 1 to 12 or 1 to 20 depending on how good your child is at recognising numbers above 10.
 - o Play the game outlined on *Higher /Lower* below.

Higher / Lower

You need number cards 1 to 12 and a pile of cubes or counters or raisins! It can be 1 to 10 or 1 to 20 depending on how confident you child is with numbers above 10.

How to play

Shuffle the cards and place them in a pile face down.

- Take a card off the top. Place it face up where you and the child can both see it. Say the number.
- o Explain that you are now going to turn over another card.
- Before you do this, the child must say if they think the number you turn over will be higher or lower than the card you are both looking at.
- o Once they have guessed, you turn over the next card.

E.g.

7

Tim guesses 'higher'

Mum turns over this:

4

- o Discuss whether the card turned over is as they said it would be.
- E.g. Tim guessed 'higher', but 4 is **lower** than 7. So Tim was wrong!
 - o If the child is right, they get a cube. If they are wrong, Mum gets a cube.
 - Put both cards under the pile, face down. Take another card from the top and place it face up in the middle. Agree what number it is.
 - Explain that you are about to turn over another card. Does the child want to guess 'higher' or 'lower' this time? Who gets a cube?
 - o Keep playing like this until one person has collected four cubes.
