Design

As a design and technologist:

Can I design with purpose by identifying opportunities to design?

Can I create cross-sectional diagrams to demonstrate my design?

Evaluate

As a design and technologist:

Can I disassemble products to understand how they work?

Can I refine work and techniques as my work progresses, continually evaluating the product design?

Can I improve upon existing designs, giving reasons for choices?

Can I identify some of the great designers in all of the areas of study (including pioneers in horticultural techniques) to generate ideas for designs?

Technical Knowledge

As a design and technologist:

Can I choose suitable techniques to construct products?

Can I strengthen materials using suitable techniques?

Can I apply appropriate cutting and shaping techniques that include cuts within the perimeter of the material (such as slots or cut-outs)?

Can I select appropriate joining techniques?

Can I select the most appropriate techniques to decorate textiles?

Can I create series and parallel circuits?

Can I use scientific knowledge of the transferences of forces to choose appropriate mechanisms for a product (such as levers, winding mechanisms, pulleys and gears)?

Can I control and monitor models using software designed for this purpose?

Can I use software to design and represent product designs?

As a design and technologist:

Can I cut materials accurately and safely by selecting appropriate tools?

Can I measure and mark out to the nearest millimetre?

Can I understand the need for a seam allowance?

Can I join textiles with appropriate stitching?

Can I make products by working efficiently (e.g. by carefully selecting materials)?

Cooking and Nutrition

As a design and technologist:

Can I prepare ingredients hygienically using appropriate utensils?

Can I measure ingredients to the nearest gram accurately?

Can I follow a recipe?

Can I assemble or cook ingredients (controlling the temperature of the oven or hob, if cooking)?
