End of Year Expectations

Geography

Year 1

Human and Physical Geography

- Discuss daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom
- Relate the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the North and South Poles
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river and weather.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, farm and house.

Geographical Skills and Fieldwork

- Use world maps and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the continents and oceans.
- Use locational and directional language [for example, near and far, left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
- Devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key.
- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds.
