Where Could We Park?

From The Pub in the village, it takes approximately 7 minutes to walk, there is ample car parking and the route is safe to walk for years 5 & 6, but younger children would need to be accompanied.

From Butt Lane, it takes 10 or 11 minutes to walk, again, there is ample parking, safe to walk and places to safely cross the road.

From The Pitt, it takes about 4 minutes to walk, it's a safe route, but parking is limited and cars would still have to drive past our school.
