## Trip to Hall Farm Park - Thursday 20th March 2025

As part of our commitment to providing an enriching and exciting curriculum, we are delighted to inform you that we have arranged for the EYFS pupils to take part in an exciting Visit to Hall Farm Park.

This will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to explore and experience farm life first hand, while learning about the animals, plants, and the natural world around them.

On the trip, the children will have the chance to meet and greet the animals. The children will be able to see and interact with friendly farm animals like cows, ponies, goats, chickens, pigs, and sheep. They will learn about the different sounds the animals make, what they eat, and how they live on the farm. Additionally, the children will have the opportunity to explore the farmyard and woodland areas. The children will have a fun and leisurely walk around the farm, where they will take in local farmland and woodland areas. Be a nature detective, look and listen for wildlife and information boards. These are just a few of the many fun and educational activities the children will experience whilst on this trip.

This trip will be a wonderful way for the children to learn through exploration, build a connection with nature, and develop an understanding of where food comes from. We are looking forward to an exciting day of discovery and fun.

We will set off and return within normal school hours. Children will be expected to wear their school uniform as usual, wellies and a coat. Please ensure your child brings a packed lunch, together with a non-fizzy drink.
