### Year 5

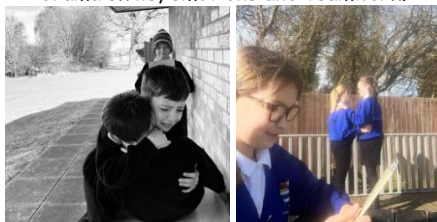
