### Reporting Covid-19 over the Christmas holidays. 18th December - 23rd December 2020

Both Mrs Hackfath and Mrs C Smith will be on call on the above dates to assist with contact tracing as requested by the Dfe.

Please may we ask that should your child develop Covid-19 symptoms within 48 hours of being in school that you email the dedicated email address [office@stanfordschool.co.uk](mailto:office@stanfordschool.co.uk) indicating which of the Covid symptoms your child is displaying and the date and time of the onset of the symptoms. We will then wait to hear from you regarding your child's test result.

Once you have advised us of the test results we will then be able to identify any children/staff member, if any, who will need to self-isolate over the Christmas period due to being classed as a 'contact.'

If we do need to advise that your child self-isolate due to being a 'close contact,' we will send you a text message. Please ensure your most recent mobile number has been shared with the school office.

### Starting new term

If your child has symptoms, is unwell, or it has been confirmed that they have Covid-19, it is very important that they do not return to school until they have been tested and if necessary self-isolated. Please contact us before bringing your child into school and we can advise you.

### Parking near school

Please do remember to park carefully and with regard to our local residents - unfortunately there have been some reports of residents not being able to access their driveways etc.

### Anti-Bullying Work

At Stanford, we also took part in Anti-Bullying Week. There were lots of excellent discussions, for example, the younger children discussed different bullying scenarios and what they could do.

#### Community Links

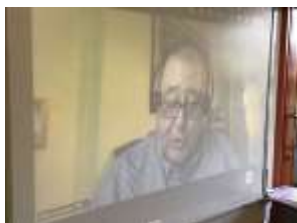
We always love inviting visitors into school and currently we continue to do this VIRTUALLY.
