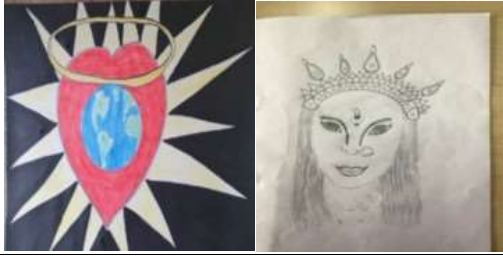

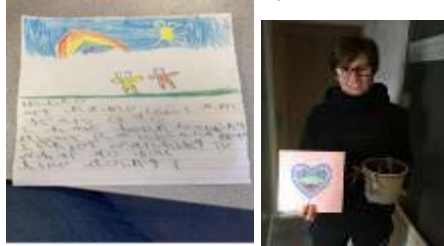
Interfaith Week
