### Well-being

Well-Being continues to be at the forefront of our curriculum at Stanford. Within our weekly PSHE curriculum, classes have been learning about and developing strategies to help and support ourselves and each other with relationships - identifying healthy relationships with others. Classes have also been discussing their ideas in our Pupil Voice meetings to share helpful tips for maintaining a positive mind-set. Our Pupil Well-Being committee have continued to work extremely hard to organise and deliver lunchtime clubs - mindfulness colouring club, 'Wake-Up, Shake-Up' and coaching buddies in the KS1 and FS playgrounds. These clubs have been very well received by pupils across the school.

Compass Go, our Mental Health Support Team have completed their first POD workshop in school on anxiety and will be starting a new POD in the Summer term. The practitioners have also delivered two workshops to our Year 5 and 6 classes. A friendship workshop was delivered to Juniper class and a Test stress workshop to Barley Class to help them prepare for their SATs tests in May.

We look forward to the swimming gala and more football tournaments next term too along with sports days, residential visit and Jubilee and Founder's day celebrations.



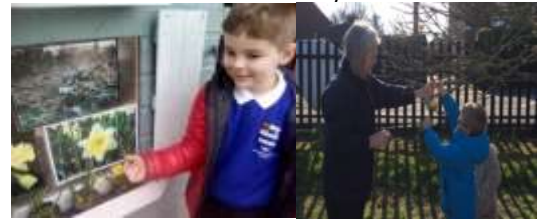
