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Dear Parent/ Carer,

I would like to provide you with information on the CGP Revision books your child has been given in Year 6, as part of the SATs revision practice. Formal SATs testing will take place week beginning 8th May 2017 and is designed to evaluate the progress your child has made at school.

There are a number of ways in which you can support your son/ daughter to be fully prepared for the forthcoming tests and more importantly, preparing for secondary home learning expectations. Pupils are aware of the SATs week and will be issued daily revision home learning (on alternate days), which is to support and consolidate their knowledge and skills. Your child should have received various revision books; Maths revision and question book, arithmetic study book, English GPS study book and punctuation, spelling and grammar SAT buster book. Ensuring pupils engage fully with revision home learning as part of their preparation for the tests will help their successes.

To ensure that students do not have gaps in their understanding of these topics, weekly home learning will be set that will link to the area of learning in school. This is required to be completed every day and all CGP books and their home diary will be expected to be in school every day. It is vitally important that pupils complete and return their home learning/ CGP books and a reward system will be in place to reward those pupils who complete. Equally, pupils who have not completed their home learning will have to catch up at break time with Mrs Hackfath.

I would appreciate your support in helping your son/daughter understand the importance of fully understanding each topic and completing daily home learning on this as it is vital in their understanding of what will be asked in the SATs tests. In addition to this, a SATs parent workshop will be held in the New Year.
